Introduction

At the time of the 2006 Census, 137 631 persons were counted within Cairns Regional Council local government area. This figure does not include overseas and domestic visitors to the local government area. The preliminary 2007 estimated resident population was estimated to be 152 103 persons. From 2002 to 2007 the average annual growth rate of the population of Cairns Regional Council was 3.1 per cent. The 45–64 years age group had the highest number of persons counted at the time of the census.

Edmonton had the highest number of persons at the time of the 2006 Census, with 8 034 persons usually resident in the suburb. This was followed by Mount Sheridan with 7 236 persons and Mooroolbool with 6 618 persons. Most suburbs within Cairns Regional Council area had the highest number of persons in the 30–44 years and 45–64 years age groups. Bungalow, Cairns North, Green Island, Manoora, and Parramatta Park had the highest number of persons in the 15–29 years age group.

Indigenous persons accounted for 7.8 per cent or 10 741 persons in Cairns Regional Council area at the time of the 2006 Census. The suburb of Manoora had the highest number of Indigenous persons. The Indigenous population had a substantially younger age profile with 39.7 per cent of persons in the 0–14 years of age when compared with the non-Indigenous population group (20.2 per cent).

In Cairns Regional Council local government area, 18.2 per cent of the population was born overseas. Of these, 26.0 per cent were born in the United Kingdom, followed by 18.1 per cent born in New Zealand and 5.9 per cent born in Papua New Guinea. 9.1 per cent of the population spoke a language other than English at home.

Couple families without children made up 38.5 per cent of all family households with one-parent families making up 18.1 per cent. In all household types, 25.0 per cent of all dwellings were lone-person households.

Separate houses accounted for 72.7 per cent of all dwellings in Cairns Regional Council area at the time of the 2006 Census. Of these, 41.1 per cent were being purchased, 29.2 per cent were fully owned and 26.6 per cent were rented. The largest number of dwellings being purchased had a monthly home loan repayment of \$950 to \$1 199.

There were 12 939 persons with a gross individual weekly income of \$1 000 to \$1 599. This was 12.0 per cent of all persons in Cairns. There were 9 889 households with a weekly household income of \$800 to \$1 199. Mount Peter (18.2 per cent) had the highest percentage of persons in the \$2 500 or more gross weekly household income bracket, followed by Cairns City with 14.9 per cent and Oak Beach with 14.5 per cent. The suburbs with the highest percentage of gross weekly individual income of \$1 600 or more, were Mowbray (9.5 per cent), Freshwater (8.9 per cent) and Clifton Beach (8.7 per cent).

At the time of the 2006 Census, 41.8 per cent of persons aged 15 years or more within Cairns Regional Council area stated that their highest level of schooling

completed was Year 12 or equivalent. A further 25.3 per cent stated that year 10 or equivalent was the highest level of schooling they had completed. 37.1 per cent of persons had achieved a certificate level of education, followed by 16.8 per cent who had a bachelor degree. The most popular field of study was engineering and related technologies (17.5 per cent), followed by management and commerce (13.1 per cent) and health (7.8 per cent).

In Cairns Regional Council area, there were 71 007 persons in the labour force at the time of the 2006 Census. Of these, 2 941 persons were unemployed. Of the total employed labour force, 16.7 per cent were working as technicians and trade workers and 15.4 per cent were professionals. The most popular method of travelling to work was by car as a driver, with 62.2 per cent of all employed persons getting to work this way.

General Geography of Cairns Regional Council

In 2008, there were changes made to the boundary of Cairns Regional Council local government area, with the amalgamation of two local government areas namely the Cairns City Council and the Douglas Shire Council. It should be noted that, throughout this report, data from the 2006 Census have been used. As the shires had not amalgamated at the time of the 2006 Census, data has been concurred to the current boundaries. Where possible the data for the former council areas have been shown.

The Australian Bureau of Statistics provides data for a variety of geographic boundaries. These boundaries are collectively referred to as the Australian Standard Geographical Classification or the ASGC. Data collected for this report are based on the local government area and suburb boundaries of the 2006 ASGC. It should be noted that not all suburbs of Cairns Regional Council local government area are contained in this report. Some smaller suburbs have been combined in the ASGC. Barron Gorge, Bonnie Doon, East Russell, Lamb Range, Macalister Range and Wooroonooran had a zero population count in the 2006 Census. Therefore there are no data available for these locations and they have not been shown in the tables.

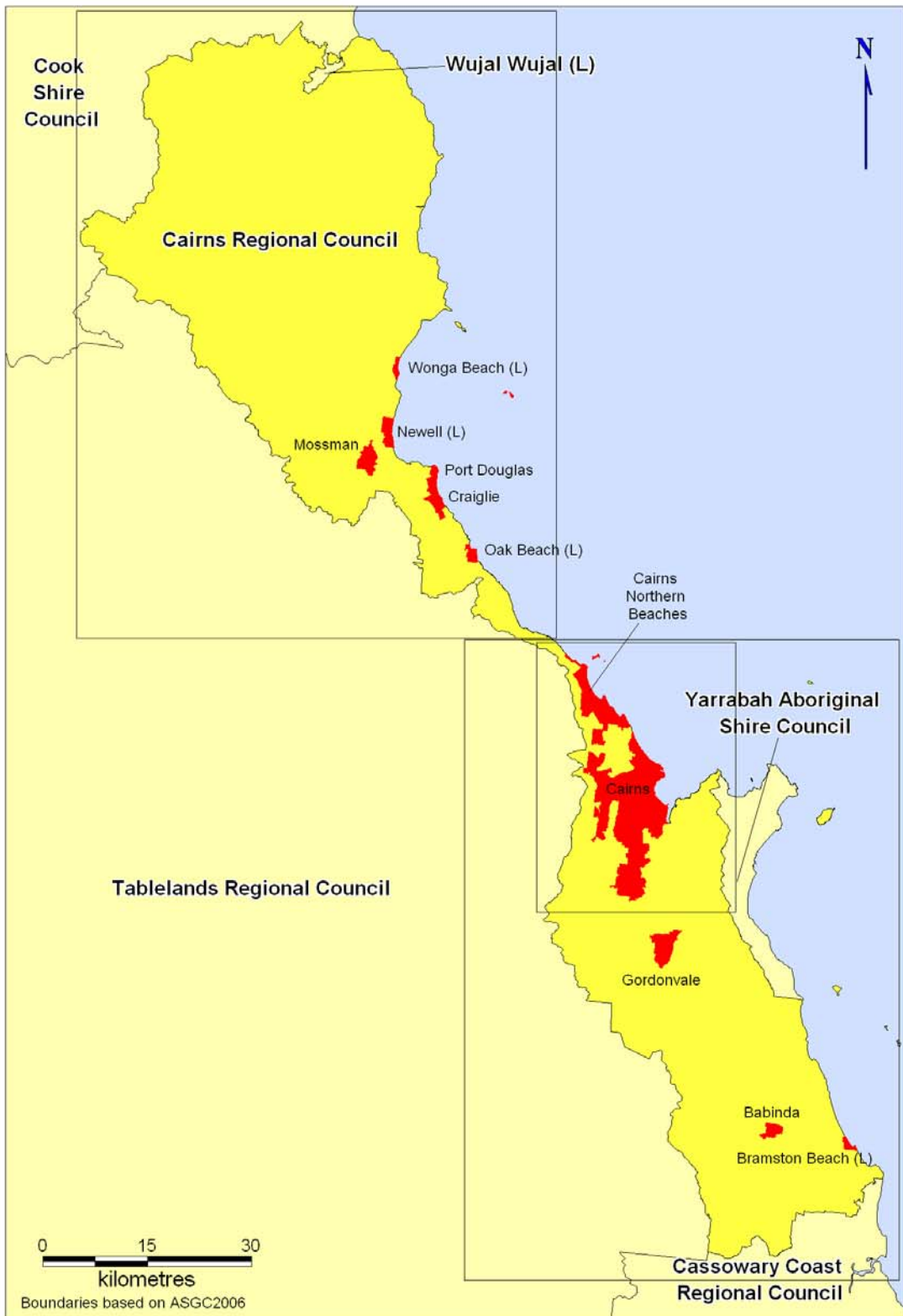


Figure 2: Southern Suburbs of Cairns Regional Council

General Demography

Population Counts

At the time of the 2006 Census, 165 015 persons were counted in the Cairns Regional Council local government area. This figure includes overseas and domestic visitors to the region and excludes those that usually live in Cairns but were away visiting other areas.

The usual resident count from the census was 137 631 persons. This includes 127 438 persons in the former Cairns City Council area and 10 193 persons in the former Douglas Shire area.

The 2007 estimated resident population was 152 103 persons. The five-year growth rate from 2002 to 2007 was 3.1 per cent. This was also the one-year growth rate from 2006 to 2007. This rate of growth is higher than the Queensland rate of 2.4 per cent over the five years and 2.2 per cent over one year.

Suburb Population

The 2006 Census counts for Cairns Regional Council's suburbs are based on the usual residence count. Edmonton had the largest number of people at the time of the census, with 8 034 persons, followed by Mount Sheridan (7 236 persons) and Mooroolbool (6 618 persons). The suburbs of Barron Gorge, Bonnie Doon, East Russell, Lamb Range, Macalister Range and Wooroonooran each had a zero population count.

Age by Sex Profile

At the time of the 2006 Census, 49.9 per cent (68 667 persons) were female and 50.1 per cent (68 964 persons) were male. Of the total population, 21.8 per cent (30 028 persons) were aged between 0 and 14 years. There were 12 334 persons, (9.0 per cent) aged 65 years or over.

The 45–64 years age group contained 25.0 per cent (34 383 persons) of the total population of the Cairns Regional Council area. The 30–44 years age group had 24.5 per cent (33 735 persons).

Suburb Age Profile

The suburbs with the highest percentage of persons in the 45–64 years age group were Degarra (58.5 per cent), Fitzroy Island (53.8 per cent) and Bramston Beach (40.7 per cent). The suburbs with the lowest percentages of persons in this age group were Cape Tribulation (14.1 per cent), Bentley Park (17.1 per cent) and Stewart Creek Valley (19.0 per cent).

Percentages in the 30–44 years age group were highest in Cape Tribulation (50.5 per cent), Ellis Beach (40.6 per cent), and Cow Bay (31.7 per cent). This age group had the lowest percentages in Fitzroy Island (0.0 per cent), Degarra (7.3 per cent) and Green Island (11.1 per cent).

Green Island (44.4 per cent), Parramatta Park (34.3 per cent) and Cairns North (32.1 per cent) had the largest percentages of persons aged 15–29 years. Mount Peter had the highest percentage in the 65 years and over age group, with 21 persons or 24.7 per cent.

In the 0–4 year age group, Fitzroy Island had the highest percentage of persons with 23.1 per cent. This was followed by Green Island (18.5 per cent) and Goldsborough (11.2 per cent). The suburbs of Daintree, Ellis Beach, and Stewart Creek Valley had no persons in this age group.

The largest numbers of persons aged 0–4 years were in the suburbs of Edmonton (746 persons), Mount Sheridan (716 persons), Bentley Park (543 persons) and Redlynch (537 persons). Edmonton, Mount Sheridan and Redlynch also had the largest number of persons aged 5–9 years, with 812 persons, 676 persons and 584 persons respectively.

Persons Aged 15 Years and Over

Within Cairns Regional Council at the time of the 2006 Census, 78.2 per cent of the population were aged 15 years and over. The suburb of Edmonton had the highest number of persons aged over 15 years and over, with a total number of 5 664 persons or 70.5 per cent of the suburb population.

The suburb of Ellis Beach had the highest proportion of the total population, with 100.0 per cent of the suburb aged 15 years or more. This was followed by Cairns City with 92.7 per cent and Portsmith with 92.3 per cent. The suburb of Bentley Park had the lowest proportion of the total population of the suburb aged 15 years and over, with 69.3 per cent. This was followed by Edmonton with 70.5 per cent and Redlynch with 71.1 per cent.

Fertility, Mortality and Morbidity

Cairns Regional Council recorded a high of 2 083 births during 2006. The number of deaths in the council area was 717 persons which presents a net growth of 1 366 persons in 2006. This was down slightly from the previous year.

The leading causes of death in the Cairns Regional Council area in 2005 were ischaemic heart diseases followed by strokes and trachea and lung cancer. The most common episodes of care for the Cairns and Hinterland Health Service District was for renal dialysis (11 173 episodes) followed by chemotherapy (2 472 episodes) and antenatal and other obstetric admissions (2 207 episodes).

Indigenous Profile

Demographics

Indigenous persons accounted for 7.8 per cent of the population or 10 741 persons in the Cairns Regional Council local government area. There were a greater number of Indigenous females (5 642 persons) than Indigenous males (5 099 persons).

In the Cairns Regional Council area, the Indigenous population has a substantially younger age profile than the non-Indigenous population. At the time of the 2006 Census, 39.7 per cent of the Indigenous population was aged 0–14 years compared with 20.2 per cent for the non-Indigenous population. The percentage of persons in the 15–44 years age groups was similar in both population groups.

The number of Indigenous persons in the 45–64 years age group was less than half that of the non-Indigenous population. The percentage of Indigenous persons in the 45–64 years age group was 12.9 per cent, compared with 26.3 per cent for the non-Indigenous population. This difference is greater in the 65 years and over age group which accounts for 3.2 per cent of the Indigenous population compared with 9.4 per cent of the non-Indigenous population.

Cultural Background

Place of Birth

At the time of the 2006 Census, 18.2 per cent or 25 056 persons of Cairns Regional Council population were born overseas. Of this, 26.0 per cent (6 509 persons) were born in the United Kingdom, 18.1 per cent (4 546 persons) were born in New Zealand and 5.9 per cent (1 467 persons) were born in Papua New Guinea.

Over half of the overseas-born persons (13 959 persons) counted in the 2006 Census arrived before 1991. During the period 2001–2005, 3 882 persons born overseas arrived in Australia and were living in Cairns at the time of the census. This is a higher number of persons than the 2 757 persons that arrived between the periods of 1996 to 2000.

Language Spoken at Home

A total of 12 520 persons stated that they spoke a language other than English at home, at the time of the 2006 Census, accounting for 9.1 per cent of the population of the Cairns Regional Council area. Of the total persons who spoke a language other than English, 12.9 per cent spoke Japanese, 10.8 per cent spoke Italian and 8.5 per cent spoke Australian Indigenous languages. Of the total population who spoke another language at home, 14.8 per cent (1 159 persons) indicated that they did not speak English well or not at all.

Suburb Cultural Background

The suburbs of Cairns North (1 014 persons), Kewarra Beach (1 101 persons), Mooroolool (1 263 persons), Mount Sheridan (1 324 persons) and Redlynch (1 079 persons) all recorded over one thousand persons born overseas. The suburbs of Oak Beach (41.0 per cent), Cairns City (31.5 per cent) and Clifton Beach (28.8 per cent) recorded the highest proportions of their total population as being born overseas. Of the total persons born overseas in the Cairns Regional Council area, 5.3 per cent were counted in Mount Sheridan, 5.0 per cent in Mooroolool and 4.4 per cent in Kewarra Beach.

The suburb of Mooroolool also recorded the highest number of persons who spoke a language other than English at home, accounting for 856 persons, or 6.8 per cent of the total persons who spoke a language other than English at home in the Cairns Regional Council area. This was followed by Mount Sheridan (813 persons or 6.5 per cent) and Manoora (713 persons or 5.7 per cent). The suburbs of Mossman Gorge, Green Island and Degarra recorded the highest proportion of persons who spoke a language other than English at home within the suburb, with 33.1 per cent, 20.7 per cent and 17.9 per cent respectively.

A total of 100 persons in Parramatta Park indicated that they did not speak English well or not at all. This was followed by 93 persons in Mount Sheridan and 86 persons in Mooroolool. Of the suburbs overseas population, Mount Peter recorded the highest percentage of persons that did not speak English well or not at all, with 23.1 per cent. This was followed by Barron with 16.7 per cent and Newell with 14.7 per cent.

Family Households

Within Cairns Regional Council on the night of the 2006 Census, 35 020 families were counted. Of these families, 41.6 per cent (14 583 families) were couple families with children and/or dependants, 38.5 per cent (13 493 families) were couple families with no children and 18.1 per cent (6 350 families) were one-parent families.

The total number of persons within all family types at the time of the 2006 Census was 100 409 persons. Of these persons, 55.6 per cent (55 827 persons) were couple families with children and/or dependants, 26.3 per cent (26 379 persons) were couple families with no children and 16.9 per cent (16 952 persons) were one-parent families.

Suburb Family and Household types

At the time of the 2006 Census, the suburbs of Edmonton (1 018 families), Mount Sheridan (1 001 families) and Redlynch (932 families) recorded the largest numbers of couple families with children family type. They also recorded the largest numbers of persons in this family type, with 4 103 persons, 3 911 persons and 3 574 persons respectively. The suburbs with the lowest number of families in this family type were Ellis Beach and Green Island, with zero families. This family type was the dominant family type in Fitzroy Island (100.0 per cent), Degarra (63.6 per cent) and Redlynch (57.8 per cent).

The suburbs with the largest numbers of couple families with no children were Mount Sheridan (677 families), Edmonton (649 families) and Mooroolbool (617 families). This family type was dominant in the suburbs of Cairns City (68.1 per cent), Bramston Beach (63.0 per cent) and Lower Daintree (61.1 per cent). 42.3 per cent of the total number of persons in Ellis Beach were in this family type. This was followed by Bramston Beach (39.1 per cent) and Palm Cove (33.9 per cent).

Manoora (425 families), Edmonton (401 families) and Mooroolbool (371 families) had the largest numbers of one-parent families. The suburbs of Mossman Gorge (43.6 per cent), Manoora (34.1 per cent) and Westcourt (32.4 per cent) had the highest percentages of families in this family type.

Housing

Housing Structure and Tenure Type

At the time of the 2006 Census, the most popular type of private dwelling structure was a separate house, accounting for 72.7 per cent (35 868 dwellings) of all dwellings in Cairns Regional Council. Of the total number of separate houses, 29.2 per cent (10 459 dwellings) were fully owned, 41.1 per cent (14 735 dwellings) were being purchased and a further 26.6 per cent (9 551 dwellings) were being rented. Of the total population, 80.2 per cent (101 171 persons) were counted in a separate house.

Semi-detached houses, townhouses, row or terrace houses accounted for 8.3 per cent (4 090 dwellings) of all private dwellings, while flats, unit or apartments accounted for 17.2 per cent (8 467 dwellings).

Of the semi-detached houses, townhouses, row or terrace houses, a large proportion were rented (63.6 per cent). Flats, units or apartments also had a high proportion being rented, with 70.4 per cent. Of the total population within an occupied private dwelling on the night of the 2006 Census, 6.3 per cent (7 917 persons) were counted in a semi-detached house, townhouse, row or terrace house, while 12.2 per cent were in a flat, unit or apartment.

There were a total of 902 dwellings that were classified as other dwelling type in Cairns Regional Council. Nearly half of these dwellings were fully owned (47.0 per cent). Of this dwelling type, the majority were occupying a caravan, cabin or houseboat (1 104 dwellings). There were 139 persons counted who lived in an improvised home or tent or were sleepers out, which was 0.1 per cent of the population.

Rent and Home Loan Repayments

Of the 18 375 occupied private dwellings being rented, 54.4 per cent were being rented from a real estate agent and 11.4 per cent from a state or territory housing authority. 19.4 per cent of dwellings were being rented for \$180–\$224 per week. The \$140–\$179 rental bracket accounted for rental payments in 19.1 per cent of all occupied private dwellings.

There were 16 759 occupied private dwellings that were being purchased at the time of the 2006 Census. Of these, 2 729 dwellings or 16.3 per cent were paying a monthly home loan payment of \$950–\$1 199. The \$1 200–\$1 399 and \$1 600–\$1 999 repayment brackets each were 13.3 per cent of the total dwellings. 3.5 per cent or 586 dwellings had home loan repayments greater than \$3 000 a month.

Suburb Housing Structure and Tenure Type

Mount Sheridan (2 306 dwellings), Edmonton (2 172 dwellings) and Mooroolbool (1 953 dwellings) had the highest numbers of separate houses. At the time of the 2006 Census, 100.0 per cent of all dwellings were classified as separate houses in the suburbs of Aloomba, Cassowary, Eubenangee, Fitzroy Island, Lower Daintree, Miriwinni, Mossman Gorge, Mount Peter, Oak Beach and Trinity Park.

Cairns North recorded the highest number of flats, units or apartments, with 1 036 dwellings or 68.8 per cent of all dwellings in the suburb. The suburbs of Manoora (956 dwellings) and Manunda (633 dwellings) recorded the next highest numbers of this dwelling type. Cairns City had 87.9 per cent of all dwellings in the suburb classified as flat, unit or apartment.

The highest number of caravan, cabin, and houseboat dwellings was located in the suburb of Manoora (84 dwellings). This was followed by Port Douglas (52 dwellings) and Woree (48 dwellings). 100.0 per cent of all occupied private dwellings in Ellis Beach were classified in this dwelling type.

Of the 12 233 dwellings in Cairns Regional Council that were fully owned, 648 were located in the suburb of Mooroolbool. A further 613 dwellings were located in Gordonvale and 560 were located in Bayview Heights. Stewart Creek Valley had 69.2 per cent of all dwellings fully owned. There were no fully-owned dwellings in Cape Tribulation and Mossman Gorge.

The suburb of Mount Sheridan had 1 133 dwellings being purchased at the time of the 2006 Census. This was followed by Edmonton with 1 104 dwellings and Redlynch with 1 026 dwellings. In Redlynch this was 55.1 per cent of all dwellings, which was exceeded only by Goldsborough with 66.0 per cent. No dwellings were being purchased in the suburbs of Ellis Beach and Mossman Gorge.

Manoora had 1 335 dwellings being rented. This was followed by Manunda with 1 031 dwellings and Cairns North with 963 dwellings. All dwellings in Mossman Gorge were being rented. There were no dwellings being rented in Ellis Beach. Goldsborough (6.4 per cent) and Green Hill (12.7 per cent) also had low proportions of dwellings being rented.

Suburb Rent and Home Loan Repayments

Of the persons paying \$0–\$99 a week in rent at the time of the 2006 Census, 210 were in Manunda, 206 were in Manoora and 112 were in Parramatta Park. All persons in Stewart Creek Valley were paying rent of \$0–\$99 a week. Manoora, with 527 persons, and Manunda, with 461 persons, also had the largest number of persons paying \$100–\$179 a week in rent.

Manoora (20 persons) had the highest number of persons paying over \$550 per week in rent. This was followed by Manunda with 12 persons and Port Douglas with 19 persons. The suburb of Green Hill had 57.1 per cent of all persons renting paying over \$550 per week in rent. Clifton Beach (4.8 per cent) and Cairns City (4.1 per cent) had the next highest percentages in all the suburbs of Cairns Regional Council.

Monthly home loan repayments of \$1–\$399 were being paid by 50 per cent of all persons in the suburb of Bramston Beach. Redlynch had the highest number of

persons making home loan repayments in this payment bracket at the time of the 2006 Census with 37 persons. This was followed by Mooroolool with 34 and Bayview Heights with 28 persons.

Redlynch (53 persons), Whitfield (31 persons) and Brinsmead (30 persons) had the largest number of persons paying \$3 000 and over in monthly home loan repayments. The suburb of Stewart Creek Valley had 100.0 per cent of persons paying this amount.

Income

Individual Income

At the time of the 2006 Census, 5 796 persons, or 5.4 per cent of persons aged over 15 years in the Cairns Regional Council area had a negative or nil income. A further 17 410 persons or 16.2 per cent had a gross weekly individual income of \$1–\$249. The \$250–\$599 income bracket accounted for 28.3 per cent of all persons. There were 4 376 persons or 4.1 per cent earning a gross individual weekly income of \$1 600 or more.

Household Income

One per cent of all dwellings at the time of the 2006 Census in the Cairns Regional Council area had a negative or nil income. This represents 515 dwellings. Twenty per cent of all households had a weekly household income of \$800–\$1 199. Only 6.6 per cent or 3 274 households have a weekly income of \$2 500 or more.

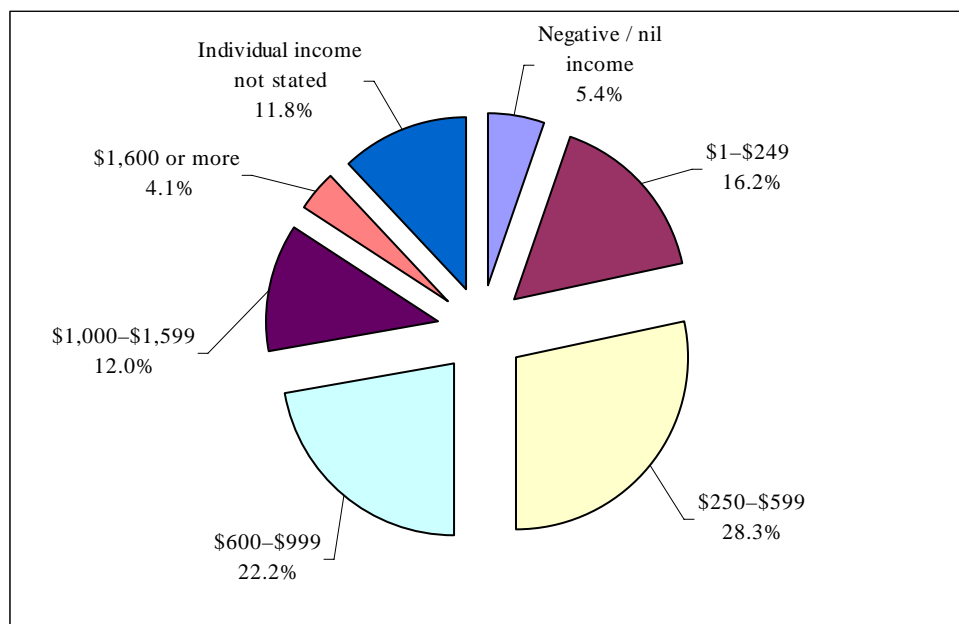

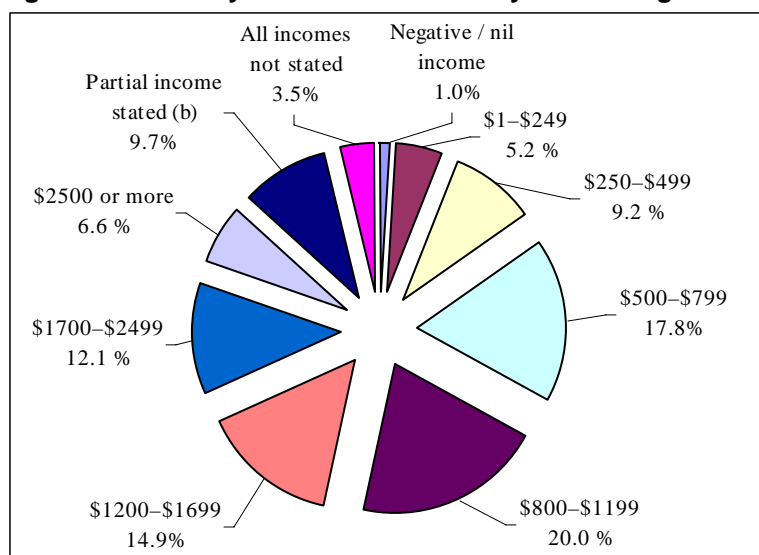

Suburb Individual and Household Income

Of the persons in Cairns Regional Council receiving a gross individual weekly income of \$1 600 or more at the time of the 2006 Census, the suburb of Redlynch had 311 persons or 7.1 per cent. This was followed by the suburbs of Brinsmead with 260 persons (6.0 per cent) and Mooroolool with 251 persons (5.8 per cent). Mowbray (9.5 per cent), Freshwater (8.9 per cent) and Clifton Beach (8.7 per cent) had the highest percentages of the total suburb earning \$1 600 or more at the time of the 2006 Census.

Of those earning a negative or nil income, Edmonton had 297 persons or 5.4 per cent of all persons in this income category. This was followed by Mount Sheridan with 297 persons or 5.1 per cent and Mooroolool with 287 persons or 5.0 per cent. The suburbs with the highest percentages of the total suburb population were Daintree (9.4 per cent), Goldsborough (8.7 per cent) and Killaloe (8.6 per cent).

The numbers of households with a negative or nil income were highest in the suburbs of Cairns North (35 households), Woree (26 households) and Mooroolool (25 households). As a percentage of the total suburb population, Portsmith had 18.2 per cent in this income category. This was significantly higher than the percentage for the remainder of the suburbs. The suburbs with the next highest percentages were Newell and Cow Bay, both with 4.1 per cent.

Redlynch had the most households earning a gross weekly income of \$2 500 or more, with 201 households or 6.2 per cent of all households in this income category. This was followed by Brinsmead with 194 households or 5.9 per cent and Mooroolool with 191 households or 5.8 per cent.

Education

Highest Level of Schooling Completed

At the time of the 2006 Census, 41.8 per cent of the population aged 15 years and over within the Cairns Regional Council area (44 991 persons) stated that their highest level of schooling completed was Year 12 or equivalent. Further 25.3 per cent or 27 196 persons stated that their highest level of schooling completed was Year 10 or equivalent. There were 500 persons who stated that they did not go to school, with a further 5 892 persons stating that their highest level of schooling was Year 8 or below.

Type of Educational Institution Attending

The highest proportion of persons in the Cairns Regional Council area was attending Infants / Primary school at the time of the 2006 Census. This was 12 282 persons or 28.0 per cent of the total population. Further 18.3 per cent or 8 040 persons were attending a secondary educational institution. Of these educational institutions, there were more males attending than females.

There were almost twice as many females attending university or other tertiary institutions (10.1 per cent or 2 239 persons) as males (5.5 per cent or 1 206 persons). Of those attending technical or further educational institutions, 5.9 per cent were females and 4.1 per cent were males.

Level of Education

Of the total persons aged 15 years and over, 48.1 per cent of all males and 24.1 per cent of all females attained a certificate level of education. This represents a total of 21 798 persons or 37.1 per cent of the total population. A further 9 870 persons or 16.8 per cent attained a bachelor degree level of education. There were more females (22.3 per cent) than males (12.2 per cent) attaining this level of education. Only 2.5 per cent of the total population held a postgraduate degree.

Field of Study

The most popular qualification field of study in the Cairns Regional Council area at the time of the 2006 Census was engineering and related technologies, which accounted for 10 297 persons or 17.5 per cent of the population. This was followed by management and commerce with 7 714 persons or 13.1 per cent and health with 4 574 persons or 7.8 per cent.

Engineering and related technologies had the highest percentage of males of all the qualification fields, with 30.7 per cent. Architecture and building, and management and commerce, had 11.9 per cent and 8.0 per cent respectively of the total male population. Of the females in the Cairns Regional Council area, 19.2 per cent had management and commerce qualifications. This was followed by 13.4 per cent with health qualifications and 11.4 per cent with education qualifications.

Suburb Education

There were 5 865 persons who stated that the highest level of schooling they received was year 8 or below at the time of the 2006 Census. Of these, the suburbs of Gordonvale (379 persons), Edmonton (359 persons) and Manoora (313 persons) recorded the highest number, of persons who stated that their highest level of school was Year 8 or below. Brampton Beach (17.7 per cent), Babinda (17.2 per cent) and Mossman Gorge (2.9 per cent) had the greatest percentage, of the total suburb population achieving this level of schooling.

Conversely, there were 45 003 persons who stated that their highest level of schooling was year 12 or equivalent. The suburbs of Mount Sheridan (2 300 persons), Redlynch and Mooroolbool (2 132 persons each) had the highest number achieving this level of schooling. The suburbs with the largest percentages of the total suburb population achieving year 12 or equivalent were Oak Beach (58.0 per cent), Freshwater (56.0 per cent) and Stratford (52.6 per cent).

The suburb of Edmonton recorded the highest number of persons attending infants / primary school, with 959 persons or 7.8 per cent of the total persons attending infants / primary school. This was followed by Mount Sheridan (828 persons or 6.7 per cent) and Redlynch (798 persons or 6.5 per cent). The suburbs with the highest percentages of persons attending this type of educational institution were Killaloe (45.9 per cent), Goldsborough (44.4 per cent) and Rocky Point (43.8 per cent).

The suburb with the highest number of persons attending university or other tertiary institutions was Trinity Beach with 164 persons or 4.8 per cent of all persons attending this type of educational institution at the time of the 2006 Census. Smithfield and Redlynch, both with 4.7 per cent, followed this. Stewart Creek Valley had the highest percentage of the suburb total attending university or other tertiary institution, with 31.3 per cent. Yorkeys Knob (19.8 per cent) and Barron (18.4 per cent) also had high proportions attending this type of educational institution.

The suburb of Edmonton (1 215 persons) had the highest number of persons with a certificate level of education. This was 5.6 per cent of all persons in the Cairns Regional Council area whose highest level of education was at the certificate level. This was followed by Mount Sheridan (1 185 persons or 5.4 per cent) and Redlynch (970 persons or 4.4 per cent). 100.0 per cent of all persons in Fitzroy Island had a certificate level of education. Mossman Gorge (82.4 per cent) and Killaloe (61.9 per cent) had the next highest levels of education when expressed as a proportion of the total suburb population.

Of all the suburbs, the number of persons with a bachelor degree was greatest in Redlynch with 546 persons or 5.5 per cent of the total persons achieving this level of education. This was followed by Mount Sheridan with 464 persons and Whitfield with 460 persons. Both suburbs accounted for 4.7 per cent of the total persons. The proportion of total persons in the suburb with a bachelor level of education was greatest in Freshwater (30.3 per cent) followed by Mount Peter (26.1 per cent) and Stratford (24.5 per cent).

There were 86 persons (5.9 per cent) with a postgraduate degree at the time of the 2006 Census in the suburb of Trinity Beach. 84 persons in both Whitfield and Edge Hill followed this, which was 5.8 per cent of the total population with this level of education. Stewart Creek Valley had the highest percentage of the suburb population attaining this level of education, with 18.8 per cent.

Labour Force

Labour Force Status

At the time of the 2006 Census, 66.0 per cent of persons in the Cairns Regional Council area aged 15 years and over (71 007 persons) were in the labour force while 24.5 per cent (26 353 persons) were not in the labour force. Of the total labour force population, 63.3 per cent were employed persons. Persons in the 45–54 years age group recorded 76.4 per cent (15 344 persons) as employed. This compares with 76.0 per cent in the 35–44 years age group. The 15–19 years age group had 53.1 per cent or 4 713 persons indicating that they were employed.

There were 2 941 people unemployed in the Cairns Regional Council area at the time of the 2006 Census. The unemployment rate, expressed as a percentage of the total labour force, was 4.1 per cent. Of these, the 15–19 years and 20–24 years age groups had the highest proportions of the age groups, with 5.2 per cent. The highest proportion of the total persons giving their labour force status as unemployed was in the 25–34 year age group with 21.8 per cent.

Occupation

Of the total employed persons in the Cairns Regional Council area at the time of the 2006 Census, the highest proportion were classified as technicians and trade workers (16.7 per cent). Professionals (15.4 per cent) and clerical and administrative workers (13.9 per cent) followed this.

At the time of the 2006 Census, males were more likely to be technicians and trade workers (27.2 per cent), followed by managers (14.3 per cent) and labourers (13.4 per cent). Almost one quarter of all employed females was clerical and administrative workers (24.0 per cent). 18.0 per cent of females were professionals and 15.9 per cent were sales workers.

Method of Travel to Work

The most popular method of travelling to work on the day of the 2006 Census was by car as a driver. 42 328 or 62.2 per cent of all employed persons in the Cairns Regional Council area travelled to work by this method. 5 113 persons or 7.5 per cent who travelled to work in a car as a passenger and 2 787 or 4.1 per cent who walked only to work followed this. There were 2 795 employed persons or 4.1 per cent who worked at home. 7 138 persons or 10.5 per cent did not go to work on the day of the census.

Suburb Method of Travel to Work

Of all the suburbs in Cairns, Edmonton had the highest number of employed persons travelling to work by car as a driver, 2 517 persons. This was followed by Mount Sheridan with 2 593 employed persons and Redlynch with 2 165 persons. The suburb with the highest percentage of the total employed suburb population travelling by this method was Newell (70.9 per cent), closely followed by Caravonica (70.0 per cent) and Bayview Heights (69.9 per cent).

There were 88 employed persons in Manoora that travelled to work by bus on the day of the 2006 Census. This was the highest number of persons to travel by this method. The suburbs of Woree (61 persons) and Mount Sheridan (57 persons) had the next highest numbers for travel to work by bus. Bramston Beach had the highest proportion of the total employed suburb population travelling by bus, accounting for 4.1 per cent. The next highest proportions were recorded in Manoora and Trinity Park, both with 3.6 per cent.

Gordonvale had the highest number of employed persons who worked from home on the day of the 2006 Census (126 persons). This was only one person higher than Port Douglas (125 persons) and 5 higher than Redlynch (121 persons.). The suburb with the highest proportion of the total employed suburb population that worked from home was Stewart Creek Valley with 37.1 per cent, followed by Daintree with 28.6 per cent. Lower Daintree and Mount Peter were next, each with 18.8 per cent.
