FLAME.ARTS ACCESS-LEG UP GRANT APPLICATION FORM

The Flame.Arts Access Program aims to create pathways to practice, career development and employment opportunities for artists who are often under-represented. The program also aims to embed a strategic and targeted focus to ensure tailored engagement by people with disability, young people and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists and creative practitioners.

Flame. Arts Access – Leg Up Grants offer small grants of up to \$1,000 for Young People and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People and up to \$1,500 for People with Disability to develop projects of an arts and cultural nature within our region, or further afield (or for individuals or organisations developing projects that specifically target/benefit one or more of the above groups).

This is an Out of Round grant: applications must be submitted at least six weeks prior to the activity start date. Applicants will be notified of funding decisions within two to four weeks after complete applications are received. Funds can be used for professional development opportunities, project costs or materials. Before completing your application, it is essential that you read the RADF Guidelines which are available on the RADF webpage including the sections 5, 7 and 9:

- Cairns Regional Council Assessment Criteria
- Reporting and acquittal requirements
- Capturing feedback with a public outcome.

Where possible address the assessment criteria as your application will be assessed on how well it meets these criteria.
