In the foyer, I can find the bar to buy food and drinks.



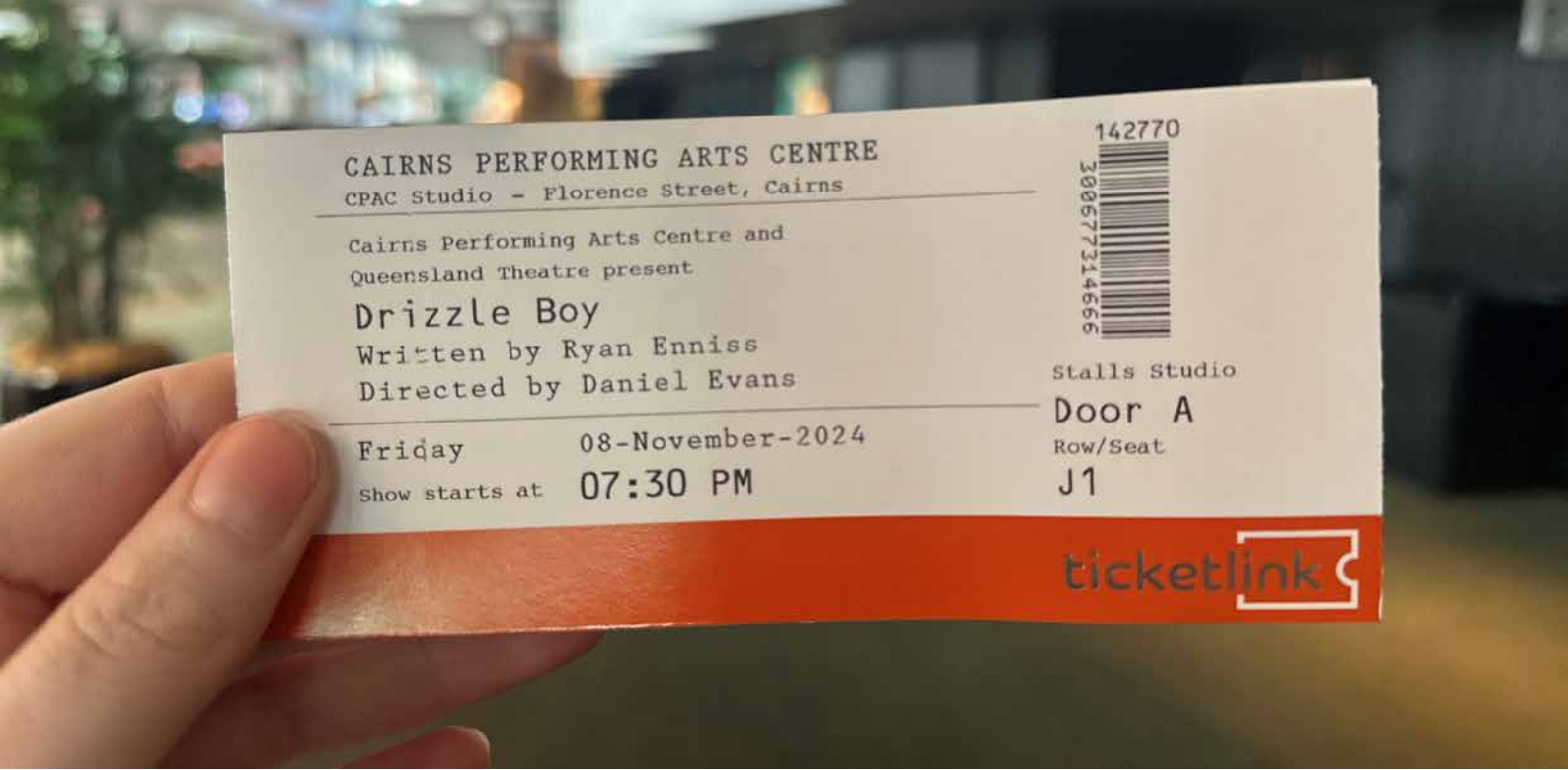
The bathroom is available before the show in the foyer.



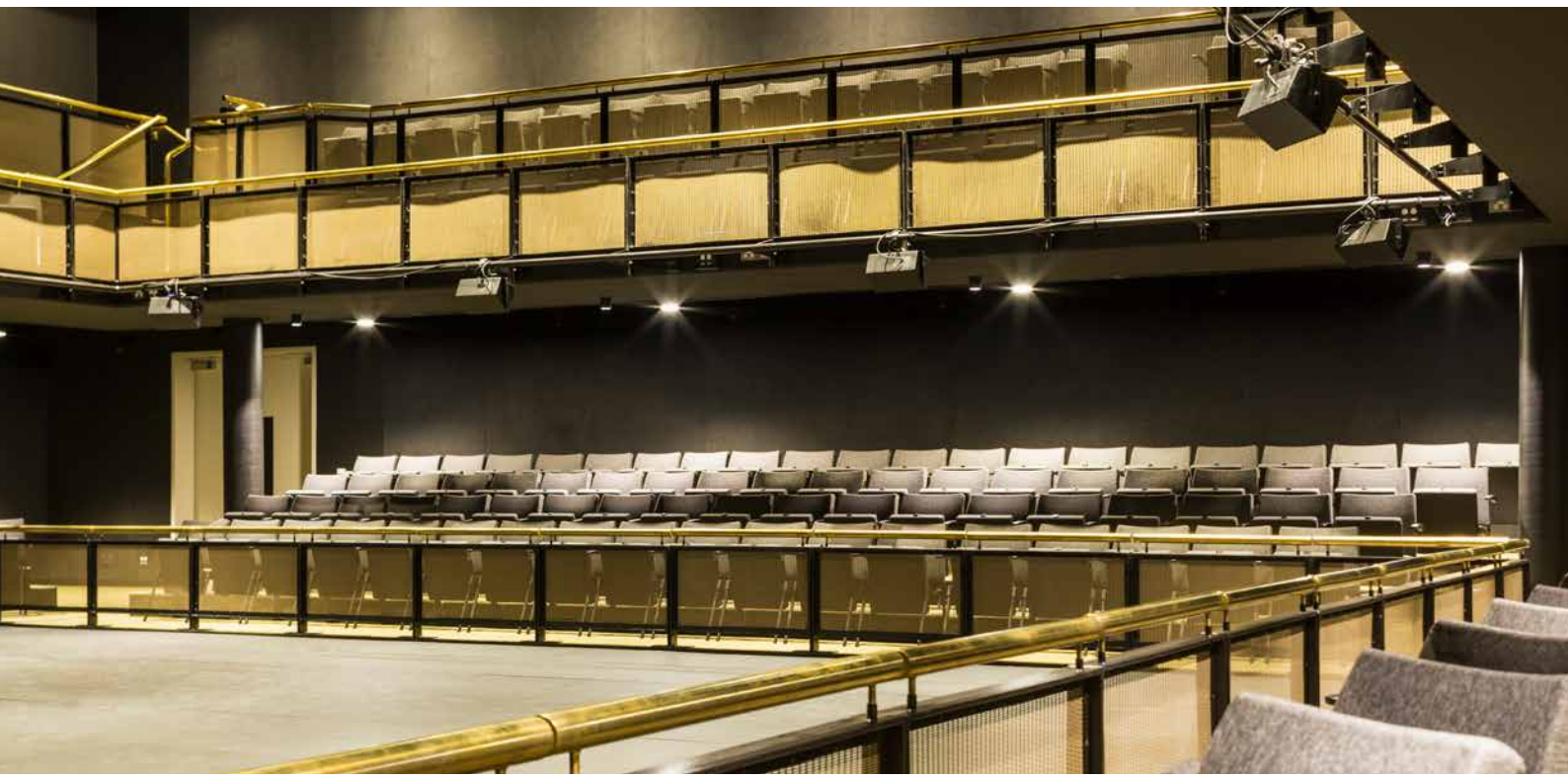
There is a Quiet Space available.

He is playing Drizzle Boy.



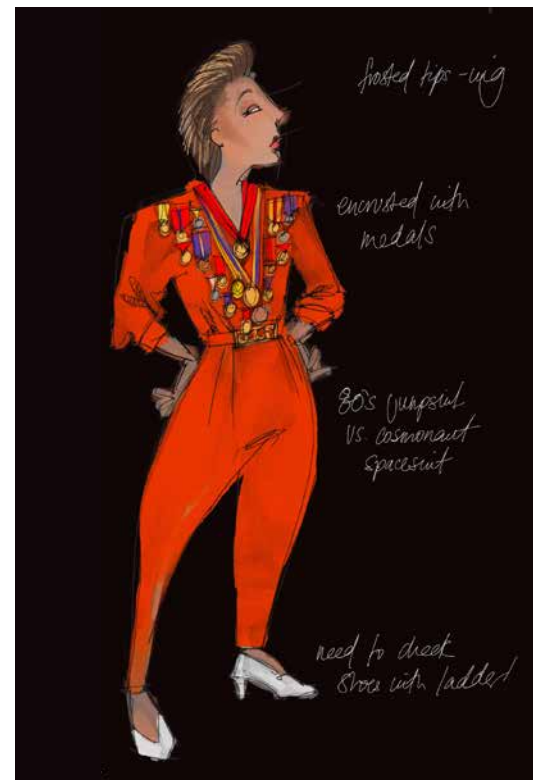
This is Judy.

is Dad.



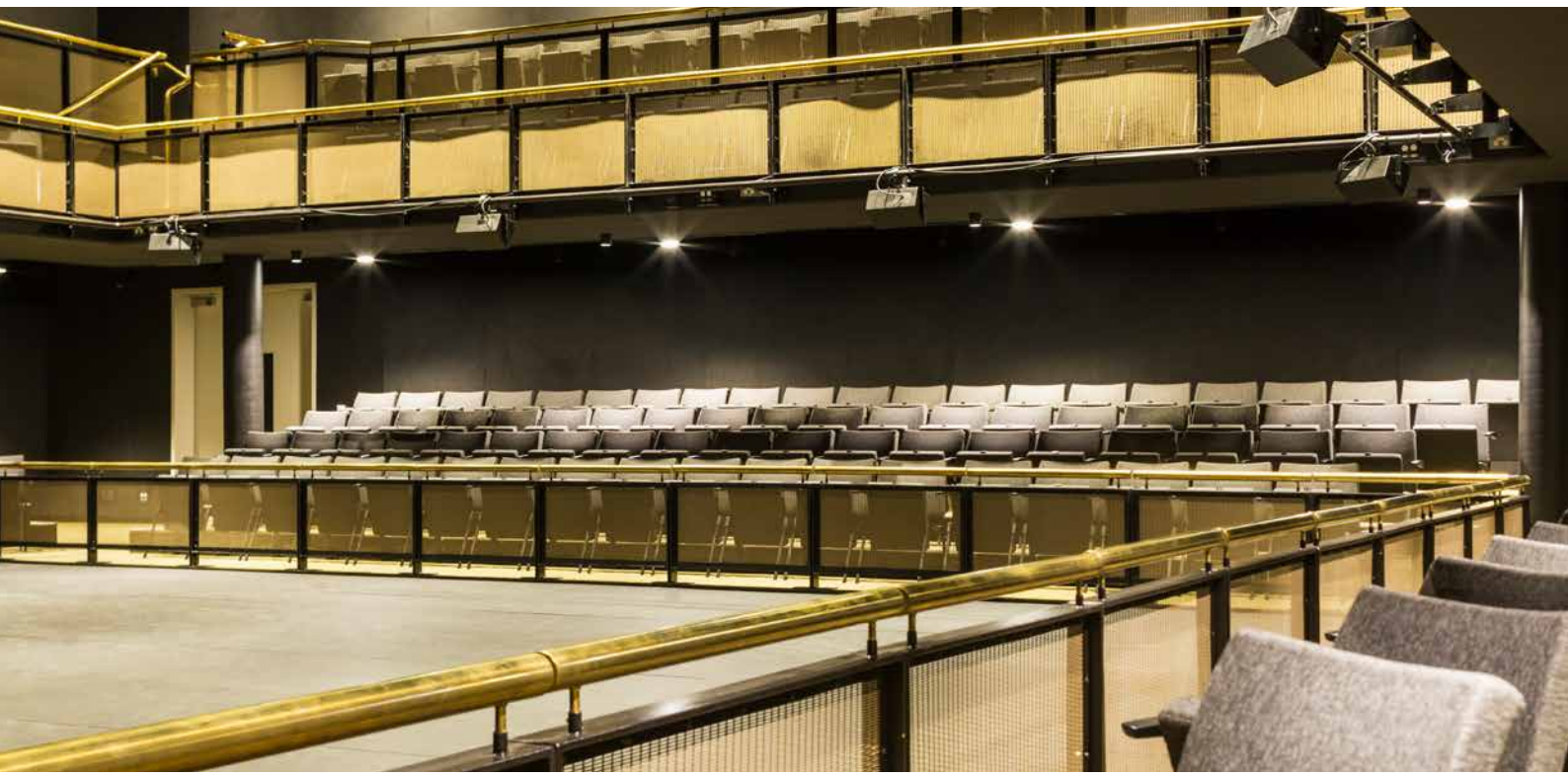
He also plays
